Attaining the award means that Bridgelea PRU is:

- The first school in Manchester to be accredited
- The first Primary PRU in the country to be accredited

BACKGROUND TO THE SETTING


- The pupils in the school range from ages 5-11 and attend the school as a preventative measure, or as their permanent specialist educational provision.
- The classes are small with a high ratio of adults to children.
- The majority of pupils are boys.

- The speech and language therapy service provide 2 full days of input a week to school.
- All staff in school have attended ELKLAN training the majority being accredited at level 2 or level 3. The SENCo and a Class Teacher are accredited to level 4.

OUR AIM

In January 2013, Bridgelea Pupil Referral started a service level agreement with the SLT service. *One of our aims was to become an accredited, communication friendly setting where each child's speech, language and communication needs are identified and accommodated for by all staff.* Through the ELKLAN accredited training and audit, WE HAVE ACHIEVED OUR GOAL!!!

We looked at the impact on staff knowledge:




"Elklan has helped with inclusion, de-escalation and most of all learning"
