Ash Class have been looking at the Oceans of the world and where they belong on a world map. They have also been learning about the different places that make up the United Kingdom; they have been looking at Human made VS Natural made aspects of these different places and how to identify them.

We also had so much fun in our reward time this term! Dressing up for role-play and creating the biggest train tracks you have ever seen. Lots of our break times spent making habitats for the insects in our play ground which the children loved too.

In Maths, we have been working on our number and place value skills such as developing fast recognition of up to 5 objects without having to count them, comparing numbers and quantities up to 10, and understanding one more and one less. In addition and subtraction, we have been getting better at automatically recalling number bonds, recalling double facts, and exploring odd and even numbers to 10. We have enjoyed working practically with our concrete Numicon resources.










Lime

Maple



We have been on a trip to the park where we worked on our team building and listening skills. We have learned that we need to bring drinks with us next time as some of us got very hot running round the park.

We have also been on a trip to the cinema all the way in Altrincham. We thought about keeping safe while travelling and were very well behaved in public. We did remember to bring some drinks and snacks this time. We had popcorn, kitkats and water.

Manchester University Occupational Therapist students have been working with us to develop sensory activities into our classroom daily routine. They have been working with some of our children to help address their sensory needs, which have been beneficial in helping our children to be ready to learn.

Regulations strategies are key to helping our children when they become dysregulated. We have been practising some breathing and movement techniques which can help our children when they need it most. Some children have introduced us to strategies that have helped them in the past and we are adding them to our regulation toolkit.

A visiting artist came to do some work with us, helping us improve our drawing skills. We created 3D images of the initials of our names. We created great masterpieces.

Jenny our visiting music teacher came each week to help us learn about rhythm, improve our listening skills and knowledge of instruments. Joseph was amazing and even had a 1:1 session with Jenny drumming.



TRACE

Pretend that your pointer finger is an imaginary pencil. and you are going to trace the number 8 in the air. on the table, or on your leg.

As you slowly trace the top part of the number 8, breathe in through your nose.

Then as you slowly trace the bottom part of the number 8, breathe out through your mouth.

Try repeating the Trace Eight breathing exercise a few more











The children in Oak class love Maths.

This term, we have looked at lots of methods to add, subtract, multiply, and divide. We have enjoyed learning how to solve the perimeter of different shapes. We used the Cuisenaire rods and number tracks to help us.

We have learnt so many skills at swimming this term. Lots of children have received their 10m, 25m and 50m swimming certificates. The children were very proud of themselves! In one of our final sessions, we have learnt about water safety. We got to swim wearing our pyjamas! It was lots of fun and we learnt how to keep safe in the water.

In music, we played lots of instruments that Jenny brought along. We have played along to different types of music on the ukulele. We also recommended our favourite types of music to Jenny! Our favourite lesson was when we used the boom whackers. We listened to Christmas songs and played along to the beat. Jenny showed us different ways we could use the boom whackers. Thank you for our amazing music lessons, Jenny!


I hope they have an amazing two weeks off and I look forward to seeing them after the holidays.

Pine

The children in Pine class had an exciting visit to the library, where they explored shelves filled with books of all genres. They eagerly picked out their favourites, from colourful picture books to captivating chapter books, and spent time reading quietly or sharing stories with their friends. The librarian guided them on how to find books, use the catalogue, and care for borrowed items. Many discovered new interests, sparking their curiosity and love for reading. It was a joyful experience that left them eager to return and continue their literary adventures.

The Pine class has been visiting the contact centre to produce some amazing beats as part of their music lessons. They explored different instruments and learned how to use music technology to create unique rhythms and sounds. Guided by experts, the children experimented with layering beats, mixing tracks, and expressing their creativity through music. The sessions were not only fun and engaging but also helped build their confidence and teamwork skills. We have loved the Contact Theatre this half term and we have made our own music using LogicPro software. We added layers to beats to create a melody and explored different instruments to make different sounds.














